PROMOTION OF PRIVATE SECTOR INVESTMENT IN URBAN CENTRES AS A STRATEGY FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE MAHAWELI REGION.

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### SYNOPSIS

This study comprises a Dissertation undertaken in partial fulfilment of the M.Sc. (Town & Country Planning) Degree Course. It has focus its attention on the promotion of private investment in urban centres of the Mahaweli Project area as a planning strategy for its economic development.

The study comprises seven chapters and the associate annexures on specific aspects.

In its Chapter One the significance of the Mahaweli development programme in the national and regional context has been discussed. Accordingly its Master Plan and contribution to development need have been analysed.

In Chapter two the urban development plans of the Mahaweli have been evaluated in the process of economic development of the Mahaweli region. In the latter connection a comparison has been made of the Mahaweli Urban Centres with the traditional urban centre development outside the Mahaweli area.

In Chapter three the theoritical aspect of private investment in urban centres and it's impact on location and economic growth have been highlighted in particular the theoritical consideration with respect to planning of urban centres with the conscious aim of attracting private investment have been discussed.

In the fourth Chapter a critical analysis of the current urban investment policies of the Mahaweli Authority of Sri Lanka has been undertaken against the previously discussed theoritical considerations.

The above have been followed by an emperical study of three newly established urban centres of the Mahaweli region in Systems H & C. It (Chapter five) provided information which satisfactorily matched the problems and theories

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discussed previously. It further pointed out that private sector had very limited opportunity to participate in the Mahaweli Urban Centres as presently planned although its potential far exceeded current capacity. It was also significant that small business had less opportunity in the urban plans of the Mahaweli Urban Centres.

In its Chapter six a policy framework for the promotion of private investment in the context of planning of the Mahaweli Urban Centres has been discussed. In this connection it has been identified a significant elements of an integrated planning policy especially with regard to Land Policy and human settlement strategies.

Chapter seven comprises the conclusions and recommendations of the study.

A Bibliography has also been compiled and included at the end of the study.
