

Chief Guest



Vidya Jyothi Professor H. Janaka de Silva Emeritus Professor of Medicine, University of Kelaniya

Vidya Jyothi Professor H. Janaka de Silva is a Professor Emeritus of Medicine at the University of Kelaniya. He was the Chair Professor of Medicine for over 26 years and served for 9 years as the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Kelaniya. He was also the Director of the Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, University of Colombo, a member of the University Grants Commission, and the Chairman of the National Research Council of Sri Lanka.

Prof. De Silva holds degrees from the Universities of Colombo (MBBS and MD) and Oxford, (PhD), and Fellowships of the National Academy of Sciences of Sri Lanka, the Royal Colleges of Physicians of London, Glasgow, Australasia and Thailand, and the Ceylon College of Physicians. He was the President of the Ceylon College of Physicians in 2004. He also is currently an elected member of the Sri Lanka Medical Council.

He has wide research interests, and has co-authored over 320 publications in indexed journals with an h-index of 65. He has received the inaugural Committee of Vice-Chancellors' and Directors' Excellence Award for the Most Outstanding Researcher in Medical & Allied Sciences, and his name is listed in the world's top 2% of scientists compiled by Stanford University, USA.

Prof. De Silva has held several editorial appointments and served on committees in health and research organizations including the WHO, Wellcome Trust and National Institute of Health Research, UK. He was conferred an honorary DSc by his University, and was awarded the national titular honour *Vidya Jyothi* - Sri Lanka's highest honor for science.

Professor Vajira H. W. Dissanayake [MBBS (Colombo), PhD (Nottingham), FNASSL, FIAHSI, FCMA and FRCP (Lond)] is the Dean of the Faculty and Senior Professor (Chair) of the Department of Anatomy, Genetics, and Biomedical Informatics of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Colombo. He has spearheaded numerous pioneering initiatives in the fields of genetics, genomics, biomedical informatics and biotheics in Sri Lanka and globally. With an h-index of 26, i-10 index of 82, and 2937 citations he is the leading researcher in these fields in Sri Lanka. In recognition of his scientific achievements he was elected a fellow of the National Academy of Sciences of Sri Lanka in 2013 – the youngest fellow of the Academy at that time, a fellow of the International Academy of Health Sciences Informatics in 2020 – the first Sri Lankan fellow of the Academy, and conferred the Sri Lankan national titular honour of *Vidya Jyothi* in 2019 on the recommendation of the Sri Lanka Medical Association.

Keynote speaker



Professor Kemal DeenEmeritus Professor of Surgery, University of Kelaniya Consultant Gastrointestinal Surgeon

Professor Kemal Deen is a distinguished Consultant Surgeon and a Professor Emeritus at the University of Kelaniya, with over two decades of exemplary contribution to surgery, research, and medical education. He is a specialist in Gastrointestinal Surgery. Prof. Deen's research has significantly advanced our understanding of anal sphincter structure and function, and improved surgical outcomes for rectal cancer and colitis patients.

After completing his medical training at the University of Peradeniya, Prof. Deen pursued advanced surgical training in the UK and USA, earning his MD from the University of Birmingham and receiving recognition as an outstanding surgical resident at the University of Minnesota. His pioneering work in creating a neo-anal sphincter and ultrasound imaging of anal sphincters has left an indelible mark on the field.

As the Founder Professor of Surgery at the University of Kelaniya, he has published over 130 peer-reviewed papers and 45 book chapters, achieving an h-index of 29. His research on sphincter-preserving colorectal cancer operations and large bowel cancer in young patients continues to be widely cited. Prof. Deen has also made significant contributions to healthcare infrastructure in Sri Lanka, notably establishing the country's first enterostomal therapy nursing program and patient support services.

A past President of the College of Surgeons of Sri Lanka and the Sri Lanka Society of Gastroenterology, Prof. Deen has served as a Visiting Professor at several international universities. His leadership extends beyond medicine, having chaired the Arthur C Clarke Centre and contributed to the development of Sri Lanka's nanosatellite program and the establishment of the Faculty of Medicine, University of Moratuwa.

Professor Ranil Fernando is a distinguished academic, surgeon, and an educator. He currently serves as the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Moratuwa. He is an Emeritus Professor of Surgery at the University of Kelaniya. He has carved an illustrious path in medicine and surgery, contributing significantly to academia and healthcare both nationally and internationally.

Professor Fernando's academic credentials are unparalleled, with accolades including an MS (Col), and a PhD from the University of Colombo. His ground-breaking PhD research focused on the epidemiology of goitres in Sri Lanka.


Being a prolific contributor to academic literature, Professor Fernando has authored the seminal book *The Technique of Thyroidectomy and its Evolution* alongside six international and two national book chapters. His research portfolio includes several publications in international and national in peer-reviewed journals. He also has delivered over 100 invited lectures globally and locally, alongside five prestigious orations and three memorial lectures.

He is an influential member of the Sri Lanka Medical Council and the Board of Management of the Post Graduate Institute of Medicine. Professor Fernando's leadership extends to editorial roles in esteemed journals like the *World Journal of Endocrine Surgery* and the *Ceylon Medical Journal*. His presidency of organisations such as the College of Surgeons and the Association of Endocrine Surgeons of Sri Lanka and Galle Medical Association underscores his pivotal role in advancing surgical education. He also is an international advisor to the Asian Association of Endocrine Surgeons.

Professor Fernando, an awardee of numerous accolades locally and internationally, continues to inspire excellence in surgical practice, research, and medical education worldwide.

Dr. Vinya Ariyaratne is a Board Certified Specialist in Community Medicine and is the President of the Sarvodaya Shramadana Movement. He is the Immediate Past President (2023) of Sri Lanka Medical Association (SLMA). Dr. Ariyaratne is a Past President and Fellow of the College of Community Physicians of Sri Lanka (CCPSL). As a senior Community Physician, Dr. Ariyaratne possesses extensive experience in public health, community development, disaster management, nutrition, child health, working with war affected communities and internally displaced persons. He has been actively involved in COVID-19 prevention and control work in Sri Lanka and serves as the Co-chair of the United Nations Humanitarian Country Team - Health Cluster. Dr. Ariyaratne was also engaged in programmes related to emergency responses to the socio-economic crisis, particularly in food security and nutrition. As the President of the SLMA in 2023, in addition to conducting the routine activities, he conducted extensive advocacy work towards promoting Patients' Rights and better governance in the health sector.

Dr. P.K. Buddhika Mahesh is a Consultant Community Physician with expertise in health research, biostatistics, and health system development. With an MD and MSc in Community Medicine, he has significantly contributed to the global and local public health landscape through extensive research, teaching, and consultancies. He has a strong academic presence, evidenced by his h-index of 13 and over 500 citations.

Dr. Mahesh has been an active academic editor for PLoS ONE and a reviewer for more than ten international journals, including those focused on neurology, public health, and clinical medicine. His research portfolio includes pioneering studies on verbal autopsy, post-stroke quality of life and public health implications of chronic diseases.

Internationally, Dr. Mahesh has collaborated on training and program development initiatives in countries like Australia, Vietnam, the Solomon Islands, and Papua New Guinea. His work has been instrumental in advancing civil registration systems and enhancing public health workforce capabilities through training and evaluation.
