# SYNOPSIS

This study is concerned with the Need for Industrial Dispersal and a Regional Industrial Development Policy in Sri Lanka. The discussion in this study extends to seven chapters. Definition of the Problem, the objectives of the study and its Limitation have been discussed in Chapter one.

The Second Chapter comprises the General Characteristics such as Location, Climatic Condition, Historical Background and Population of Sri Lanka. This chapter also reviews the economic structure of the country and the role of Industry and Agriculture. It also deals with the Availability of Resources in Sri Lanka for Industrial Dispersal of Moratuwa, Sri Lanka.

In the Third Chapter, it attemps to review the Sri Lanka's Industrial Policy in relation regional planning under four distinct periods between (1948-1982).
